ANDREW CARNEGIE

Andrew Carnegie (1835-1919) was born in Scotland and immigrated to America in 1848. In a rags-to-riches story, Carnegie worked his way up the business ladder. While still a teenager, a wealthy businessman allowed Carnegie access to his personal library. Carnegie never forgot the opportunity to improve himself.

Upon his retirement, Carnegie had become the richest man in the world. Believing that “the man who dies rich, dies disgraced,” Carnegie began giving away his fortune through endowments. Carnegie launched a library program that built 2,509 libraries around the world. Forty-one were built in Washington; 33 survive.
